CITIZENS' COMMENTS

- 1) Ken Hughes, Chairman of the Planning Commission, noted his primary take away from the recent dust teleconference was the accessibility of air quality monitors. For \$250 \$300 each, the City of Nome could monitor the issue in real time. He suggested deploying a few at the Elementary School where there is an Internet connection to monitor Nome's dust control efforts.
- 2) Steve Smith presented himself as available for questions should the Council have any concerning the Sunset Firing Range permit.
- 3) Ralph Ray suggested the City of Nome issue municipal bonds to finance the paving of the City's streets, noting the current attractive rates in the municipal bond market. He suggested a small excise tax on fuel might also assist with financing the project.
 - Council Member Brown opined the project would be prohibitively expensive, but suggested the Planning Commission evaluate its feasibility.

UTILITY MANAGER'S REPORT

- A. Activity Report: May 31 June 7, 2019.
 - Assistant Utility Manager Morton presented his verbal report, noting the fluoride pump was offline waiting for the delivery of parts, the lift station at N and Front St is again operational, that Lucas Bauman was promoted to chief mechanic, that July 26th should be the closing date for the DEC loan refinance, and that the utility passed a surprise inspection by DEC last Saturday.

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

- A. Activity Report: May 31 June 7, 2019.
 - Manager Handeland presented his written report, thanking all those involved in the clean-up efforts, Dawn Ubelaker for her work with animal control and the cemetery, and Stan Andersen for voluntarily coordinating burials, plot reservations and other cemetery tasks. He noted that free dump Saturdays was not intended for businesses, only residential trash. Manager Handeland explained the reasoning behind the gravel spec remaining the same following the previous meeting and that work was being done on Steadman Field to keep it open while keeping it clean and safe. He noted the hiring of Sharon Sparks at NPD and Mike West for boiler work in the City's buildings and finished by alerting the Council to a work session on July 22 concerning public private partnerships and port development.
 - Council Member Mark Johnson asked for an update on the online sales tax discussion.
 - Director Liew and Manager Handeland explained the status of the discussion at AML, the requirements for setting up a statewide entity to process online sales tax on behalf of the State's municipalities, the streamlining of definitions, and the potential software involved.

to Nome Sportman Association for Sunset Firing Range through 6/30/2020.
