- A. Letter of May 12, 2019 from Lahka Peacock to Nome City Council re: Inebriates Spoiling an Iconic Photo Spot.
- B. Email of May 21, 2019 from AMCO to City of Nome re: Restaurant Designation Permit Application for Airport Pizza.

A motion was made by C. Reader and seconded by C. Martinson to approve the Restaurant Designation Permit Application for Airport Pizza.

- C. Letter of May 23, 2019 from Nome Sportsman Association to City of Nome re: Land Use Permit Sunset Firing Range.
 - Manager Handeland explained the City used 99 year lease terms with other governmental agencies but not yet with private organizations. He suggested updating the language with renewal terms.

A motion was made by C. Reader and seconded by C. Brown to approve the land use permit.

Discussion:

- Council Member Brown noted the original intent of acquiring the land was to establish a shooting range to replace the older range. He suggested potentially permanently designated as a shooting range.
- Mayor Beneville noted the membership fees kept the public out of the range.
- Steve Smith, President of Nome Sportsman Association, gave a history on the land use permit and explained the membership and gate was required by their insurance carrier. He explained the \$50 a year dues helped cover insurance and basic maintenance for the range.
- Council Member Reader asked if the in-kind use of the heavy equipment was reasonable and sustainable.
- Manager Handeland suggested the lease be approved by resolution or ordinance rather than by motion as having an official record of the action would be preferable.

- D. Response of May 24, 2019 from Manager Handeland to AK Dept. of Environmental Conservation re: Former Alaska Gold Power Plant.
 - Manager Handeland explained the history of the disagreement between DEC and the City of Nome.
 - Council Member Reader surmised developing the skating rink project would cost the city even more.
 - Mayor Beneville opined the generators and stacks at the old power plant should be preserved for a future walking tour of Nome.
 - Manager Handeland noted such would need to be budgeted for the future.
- E. Thank You Card from Nome Community Center to City of Nome re: Garco Building Use.
- F. Thank You Card from NBHS Class of 2019 re: Thanks for the Support.
- G. Thank You Card from Nome Nordic.

CITIZENS' COMMENTS

- 1) Colby Engstrom reiterated his concerns and frustrations over the permitting process for the old Twin Dragon building at the corner of Front St and Steadman. He explained that he was promised an answer within the week of his statements at the May 13 meeting and had just recently received his 5th required elevation for the building. He begged for an answer on how to move forward, explaining he was going broke trying to do the right thing. He also noted that the assessor had doubled the value of his property, which was still not useable.
 - Manager Handeland stated the city attorney had explained the matter would have to be settled via lawsuit. He noted that he was a strong supporter of the project, but following the attorney's advice. Manger Handeland promised Mr. Engstrom a meeting on June 6 at 9 AM.
 - Council Member Mark Johnson opined that the City should find a way to be more supportive of business while complying with regulations.
 - Manager Handeland gave a brief explanation of flood plain regulations and the potential difficulties they can cause.
- 2) Jessica and Howard Farley, Jr. reiterated their frustration with the City's permitting process. Ms. Farley explained the history of their 100 East King project and opined that her request from March 2, 2019 was reasonable and though a refund of the permit fees is not a legal obligation of the City, she called it a moral obligation. Ms. Farley contended that though she and Mr. Farley made a mistake in the windows they installed, the error lay with the City of Nome. Ms. Farley explained that she was considering a class action lawsuit and had found an attorney that was willing to take her case. She noted a sale fell through because the bank wouldn't finance the purchase due to the windows. She requested an apology from the three people involved in the permit and that her permit fees be refunded.

3) Ken Hughes requested that the gravel bid on the agenda be modified so that the fines content better support the calcium chloride the City uses as a binding agent to keep the dust down.

NEW BUSINESS

- A. Memo of May 23, 2019 from Finance Director Liew to Mayor Beneville and Common Council re: Proposed 2020 City of Nome Budgets.
 - Manager Handeland drew the Council's attention to the revised memo from Finance Director Liew.
 - Director Liew explained the process of bringing the budget to its present iteration, with a \$1.38 million draw from the fund balance. She explained different revenue streams in terms of what aspects of the budget they covered.
 - Council Member Reader asked how sustainable such a draw was.
 - Director Liew conjectured the City would be down from \$8 million in unassigned fund balance noted in the FY 18 audit to about \$4.7 million in fund balance by the end of FY 20.
 - Council Member Reader requested a plan moving forward, noting that it's difficult for people who've become used to a certain budget to move backwards to lower amounts.
 - Director Liew suggested biannual budgeting, priority based budgeting, and greater justification of departmental budgets as a means of addressing budgeting issues.
 - Council Member Mark Johnson asked for and Director Liew gave explanation of revenue increases incorporated into the revised budget.
 - Council Member Brown surmised the impact of the Polaris fire may have been overestimated.
 - Council Member Mark Johnson expressed appreciation for staff going over the budget with a fine toothed comb.
- B. O-19-06-01 An Ordinance to Establish, Approve, and Adopt the FY 2020 City of Nome General Fund Municipal Budget and Exercising the Power to Assess and Authorize the Levy of a General Property Tax, FIRST READING/DISCUSSION.

Discussion:

- Council Member Reader asked about the discrepancy between the overtime lines in FYs 19 and 20.
- Manager Handeland noted the differences in the salary lines, explaining the hours were backfilled with overtime in FY19, but were budgeted in FY20.
- Council Member Reader asked if the contribution to Nome Preschool Association of \$65,000 was sustainable year after year, noting the organization would get used to the amount.
- Council Member Brown noted the same concern over the City's contribution to Nome Public Schools budget, noting education as a target of cuts in the State budget.
- Council Member Mark Johnson opined such a comparison was like apples to oranges in terms of size.

 - Manager Handeland presented his written report, thanking Northrim Bank and NAC for the flower baskets along Front St. He referenced Mr. Peacock's letter in communications and noted that draft ordinances attempting to address the public inebriation issues would be presented at a work session over the summer.
