A RESOLUTION CANVASSING THE RESULTS OF THE OCTOBER 1, 2019  
 ANNUAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION

WHEREAS, we, the members of the City Council of Nome, have canvassed the returns of the Annual Municipal Election, held on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of October, 2019, for the purpose of electing the Mayor, two City Council seats, two Utility Board seats, and two School Board seats; and,

WHEREAS, we find that at said election there were 502 ballots cast and the following number of votes were counted:

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Council of Nome, that the following candidates, having received a sufficient plurality for the seats in which they were candidates, are hereby declared elected:


Mayor – 2 Year Term <b>Richard Beneville</b>	Term ending October 2021
Council Seat “E” – 3 Year Term <b>Jerald Brown</b>	Term ending October 2022
Council Seat “F” – 3 Year Term <b>Mark A. Johnson</b>	Term ending October 2022
Utility Board Seat “A” – 2 Year Term <b>Patrick Knodel</b>	Term ending October 2021
School Board Seat “A” – 3 Year Term <b>Darlene Trigg</b>	Term ending October 2022
School Board Seat “E” – 3 Year Term <b>Barbara J. Amarok</b>	Term ending October 2022

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that per Nome Code of Ordinances, Chapter 7.25, Section 140, a run-off election is required for Utility Board Seat “D,” to be held on Tuesday, November 5, 2019:


“No person may hold the office...as a result of any election...without receiving a majority of the votes cast for the office. A majority is defined as fifty percent plus at least one vote. In the event that no single candidate receives a majority, the two candidates receiving the most votes in the regular election shall have a run-off election on the first Tuesday of the month following the subject election to establish a winner.”

**BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED** that the Mayor and City Clerk execute the foregoing canvass as provided by law.
