OPERATING PROCEDURES FOR TRANSPORTING ROCK, SAND AND/OR GRAVEL ACROSS THE PORT OF NOME DOCK FACILITIES:

Also addressed in Port of Nome Tariff Section: 05.020 (a) 3.

- 1. <u>Contractors loading material sized 12" or smaller are required to use a conveyor loading system to prevent material loss overboard. Methods for loading all material **must be approved** by the Harbormaster.</u>
- 2. Contractor must notify Harbormaster of vessel's estimated time of arrival (ETA) at least 24 hours prior to arrival.
- 3. Contractor must make arrangements with the Harbormaster in advance to pre-stage any material(s) on port property in preparation for barge arrival.
- 4. All excess material must be gathered and removed (unless other arrangements are made with Harbormaster) within 24 hours of loading.
- 5. Any ramp or berm created to assist in loading **MUST** be removed immediately after each barge loading.
- 6. When more than one operation is underway at the dock, Contractors will work together on equipment, traffic, safety and cleanup responsibilities.
- 7. All equipment and/or supplies belonging to contractor(s) must be removed from dock within 24 hours of loading unless otherwise arranged.
- 8. Contractor is required to report any damage to facility or material loss overboard to the Harbormaster immediately.
- 9. Facilities available for loading rock, sand and gravel materials are:
 - * Causeway West Gold Dock
 - * Harbor Barge Ramp & High Ramp
- 10. Load limits on all bridges and access roads are to be strictly followed.
- 11. Contractors are reminded that the Causeway and Harbor are multi-use facilities and are encouraged to coordinate and cooperate with other traffic.
